Public Service and Human Capital Development Cabinet Secretary, Hon. Justin Muturi, challenged Huduma Centre managers to embrace creativity and innovation to enhance efficiency and effectiveness in service delivery to Kenyans.

Speaking during the closing ceremony of the 2nd Annual Huduma Centre Managers Conference in Mombasa, the Cabinet Secretary emphasized that Huduma Kenya, reflecting the face of government, must uphold the highest standards in serving the public.

Huduma Kenya Secretariat CEO, Mr. Ben Kai Chilumo, encouraged managers to adopt clear visions, goals, and strategies for their centers while fostering collaboration with other stakeholders to improve service delivery.

During the event, top-performing Huduma Centre managers for the 2023/24 financial year were feted for their exceptional service delivery. Mombasa Huduma Centre took the top spot, followed by Nyamira, Machakos, Samburu, and Taita Taveta, respectively.
