




LEADERSHIP TRANSITION



KENYA'S PUBLIC SERVICE AND ESAMI FORGE PARTNERSHIP TO BOOST CAPACITY BUILDING

In a significant move to strengthen public sector capacity, the Deputy Head of Public Service, Mr. Amos Gathecha, and the Director General of the Eastern and Southern African Management Institute (ESAMI), Dr. Peter Kiuluku, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) aimed at fostering collaboration between the Ministry of Public Service, Human Capital Development & Special Programmes, and ESAMI.

The agreement outlines a comprehensive framework for cooperation in areas critical to public service improvement.

As part of the MoU, a joint technical committee will be established to oversee the development and implementation of strategic programmes and curricula tailored to enhance performance, promote knowledge sharing, and entrench best practices within the public sector.

The collaboration will span key areas such as research and policy formulation, consultancy services, training needs assessment, good governance, resource mobilization, and monitoring and evaluation.

The two institutions also pledged to pursue strategic partnerships and linkages with other agencies to strengthen institutional capacity and ensure sustainable public service delivery across the region.
